Request for help

In order to continue to operate, there is a most pressing need for help on our Club nights, as I explained at the AGM in April. We are sure that there are members who may not wish to join the Committee, but would be willing to assist with the running of the Club at our fortnightly meetings on a rota basis. The jobs are as follows:-

1. **Deputy Hall Manager(s)** – Harry Wickens urgently needs a back-up, since he is likely to be absent for a number of meetings next season. The job entails arriving at the Hall at 7pm, getting the equipment out and setting it up, dealing with any problems which may arise during the evening, and then putting everything away at the end of the evening. Suitable training will be given, and we hope to recruit a team of two or three people to share this role.

2. **Refreshments' Manager(s)** – Elizabeth Baker retired from this job at the end of last season. In order to continue offering refreshments, we need to recruit a team of several people to manage the refreshments on a rota. The person in charge for the evening needs to arrive soon after 7pm, fill up the urn and put it on, put out the cups on the trays, and get everything ready. He or she will be assisted during the interval by two volunteers with the serving of the refreshments and clearing up.

3. **Helping with refreshments** – Helping to serve the refreshments and clear up during the interval

4. **Putting out chairs** – This needs to be done between 7.00 and 7.30pm

5. **Welcome Desk** – We should like to recruit several people to share the manning of the welcome desk with one or more members of the Committee, as members arrive.

6. **Selling raffle tickets** – They need to be sold to members as they arrive between 7.30 and 8.00pm, once or twice a year
